JOB PURPOSE:

The Arts, alongside sport and Youth Work is at the heart of HideOut's offer to young people. The Arts offer is wide ranging and includes visual arts, music, media, dance and drama. As a member of the Creative Arts Team, leading on the coaching and teaching of music, you will be key in ensuring young people have access to an exciting and creative music programme that will be challenging, stimulating, fun, engaging and developmental. You will be involved in teaching the fundamentals of a single, or range of music activities, enabling young people to explore their creativity and grow their skills.

Within the Arts team we are looking for a range of talented youth arts workers to make up a team with a diverse set of skills and expertise, who are also passionate about working with young people. Ideally, you will have experience delivering one or more of the following music arts: Teaching and playing instruments (drums, guitar, piano, more), Music production and Vocal coaching.

CONTEXT OF THE POST:

Manchester is a growing global City with a population of circa 550,000 people, including an estimated 140,000 children and young people aged 0-19 years old. The city has faced significant cuts to its youth and play services over the past decade and with rising disproportionate child poverty rates when compared nationally, children and young people need universal services that empower them, aid their personal and social development and provide

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positive opportunities more than ever. Manchester is bringing key cross sector stakeholders together including business, public and third sector leaders to develop and sustain a new world class Youth Zone in East Manchester.

OnSide Youth Zones, established in 2008, has been growing rapidly and has ambitious plans to create 100 Youth Zones in towns and cities, giving young people somewhere safe and inspiring to go in their leisure time. They are amazing places: accessible, vibrant, welcoming, fun and caring are just some of the words used by young people to describe their Youth Zone. HideOut Youth Zone (opening in Spring 2020) will be no exception and is part of the OnSide network of Youth Zones.

Youth Zones give young people affordable access to a broad range of sport, arts and employability services, designed to help them lead active, positive lives and raise their aspirations for themselves and their community.

HideOut Youth Zone is centrally located, dedicated to young people and makes a bold statement about the importance of giving young people high quality places to go in their leisure time. Open 7 days a week including school holidays, the Youth Zone's purpose is to help young people grow to be happy, healthy and successful adults. The state-of-the-art £6.6 million building will provide young people with access to a range of activities, all offering young people the opportunity to try new things, meet new friends and gain support from friendly, warm and positive staff and volunteers. The facilities include a 3G pitch, gym, sports hall and recreation area, and dance, arts, music and media suites.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES - DETAILED

- Together with the Creative Arts Co-ordinator and the Head of Youth Work, develop and implement a Musical Arts programme that is exciting, challenging and ever-changing
- To deliver music activities to young people ranging from vocal training to music production
- To listen to young people and create a seasonal music programme
- The role is 100% face to face delivery with young people
- To work directly with young people to develop their social skills and encourage them to use their musical talents
- To directly deliver a high-quality music programme of activities that is exciting, safe, varied, innovative, developmental and directly responds to the diverse needs, concerns and interests of our members
- Introduce young people to the various forms of music and performing arts, such as production, performance, recording and song writing.
- To have great energy to establish positive relationships with young people and the wider youth work team and visitors to the Youth Zone
- To support artist and band development
- To work flexibly to ensure the needs of the members who are disadvantaged, discriminated against or who have additional needs
- To ensure that the members maintain a high standard of behaviour and discipline during sessions by making the area a hub of activity and fun
- To ensure the participation of young people in activities and ensure that their ideas contribute fully to the delivery of activities
- To encourage attendance and participation in music activities, particularly by young people who do not usually participate in music or art
- To assist with any promotional activities and visits that take place at the Youth Zone
- To actively promote the Youth Zone and positively contribute towards increasing Youth Zone membership
- To promote and safeguard the welfare of young people at all times
- To be able to think on your feet and deliver an activity with minimal equipment
- Ability to enthuse others including staff, volunteers and young people
- To make the environment fun and the place young people want to be
- To be an active member of the team and operate in line with the values and principles of HideOut Youth Zone
- Carry out any other reasonable duties as requested by management

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES - CREATIVE ARTS ACTIVITIES

- Be a role model for young people and present a positive "can do" attitude
- Take personal responsibility for own actions
- Commit to a culture of continuous improvement
- Work within the performance framework of HideOut Youth Zone and OnSide
- Represent HideOut Youth Zone positively and effectively in all dealings with internal colleagues, and external partners
- Comply with all policies and procedures, with particular reference to safeguarding, codes of conduct health and safety and equality and diversity to ensure all activities are accessible
- Represent HideOut Youth Zone positively and effectively in all dealings with internal colleagues, and external partners

- To be alert to issues of safeguarding and child protection, ensuring the welfare and safety of Youth Zone
 members is promoted and safeguarded, and to report any child protection concerns to the designated
 Safeguarding Lead using the safeguarding policies, procedures and practice (training to be provided)

- To actively promote the Youth Zone and positively contribute towards increasing Youth Zone membership
