We are HideOut Youth Zone, a charity for Manchester's young people, set up to give them the opportunity to discover their passion and their purpose.

HideOut Youth Zone is part of the OnSide Youth Zone Network, a growing group of Youth Zones across the UK.

Here at HideOut, we give young people from a diverse range of backgrounds access to incredible facilities in a vibrant, purpose-built space packed with engaging activities. We provide them with the opportunity to make friends, develop new skills, unlock their potential and have fun.

Beyond the amazing building (located on Hyde Road, Gorton), our greatest strength is our team of dedicated and caring youth workers, who are there for young people every day of the week, however they need them. Whether through a conversation, a project, a game or targeted support, HideOut Youth Zone provides life-changing support that helps local young people to thrive.

We believe that young people deserve the best and we won't settle for giving them anything less.

This is passionate, properly-funded youth provision. A unique partnership between young people, their community, local authorities, private business leadership and a growing movement of supporters.

Together, we believe that all young people need is a chance to discover what they've got and where it could take them.

YOUNG PEOPLE

Young people first

A major new study into the social lives of children and young people aged 11-18 in England (OnSide, Nov 2022), shows that young people in the Northwest are navigating a world outside of school that is increasingly isolated and home-based, with limited opportunities for face-to-face socialising, making new friends or meeting people in person.

Findings show:

- 49% of young people in the Northwest spend most of their free time in their bedrooms
- 17% of the Northwest's young people spend most of their free time alone
- 41% of young people in the Northwest don't have opportunities to meet new people or make friends
- Only 14% in the Northwest said that they spent most of their free time in person with their friends

Youth Zone's like HideOut Youth Zone play a vital role in enabling young people to build rich social lives, develop skills and build resilience.

- 84% of young people in the Northwest who currently attend a Youth Zone say it has made a positive difference to their lives
- 71% say it has given them new skills
- 27% say 'making new friends' is the most popular reason for young people to attend Youth Zones

HideOut officially opened its doors to members in September 2020 (in the middle of the global Covid-19 pandemic) and has since made incredible progress.

In 2022, HideOut reached a new membership milestone of 6,000 membership sign ups.

The Youth Zone is open seven days a week, 52 weeks of the year.

HideOut works consistently to provide vital support to the young people of Manchester.

Per week, HideOut offers:

- three Junior Club sessions (8-12 years)
- four Senior Club sessions (13 19 years, or up to 25 with additional needs)
- one Inclusion Club session (8-25 years)

Young people attend the Youth Zone for just a £5 annual membership and 50p per visit. Through this, they have access to over twenty activities per night ranging from sport, creative arts and life skills (cooking and health and wellbeing).

HideOut's strength comes from robust and developed partnerships. HideOut works with the local community to deliver specialised projects for members, including exploration of culture, heritage and identity.

HideOut Youth Zone works with some of Manchester's most vulnerable young people. It is vital HideOut provides the much-needed support and basic necessities young people need.

It's been a long while since I've had one of those profound moments of gratitude; realising how far we have come, and being so thankful for the things we are so privileged to experience.

There was a time that I never knew for sure how long we had with Jacob, what I'd get to see him grow up to do, and every day I give thanks.

Yesterday was one of those profound moments.

l didn't think l'd ever see Jacob's once weak and broken little body bouncing around a boxing ring.

With late effects from almost 4 years of [Leukemia] treatment still affecting him physically, and despite being off school with a rotten cold - he was determined to complete the 10-week Boxing project he's been taking part in at our amazing youth club here in Gorton.

Parent feedback

Physical activity is essential for healthy and optimal development throughout childhood and early adulthood; HideOut Youth Zone provides many opportunities for a physically active routine.

HideOut offers a range of sporting opportunities, ensuring all activity is inclusive and accessible for everyone.

From rock climbing to a fully equipped gym, to roller-skating to mixed martial arts, young people have the opportunity to engage in try, train and team activities.

HideOut aims to raise young people's aspirations through new and exciting experiences, with the opportunity to develop themselves through AQA projects and certification.

- 16 young people completed AQA Boxing project
- 15 young people completed AQA Climbing project
- 12 young people completed Snow Camp

In 2022, one of HideOut's Senior Club members, Shanay, had the opportunity to travel to Italy after training with Snow Camp. She qualified at First Tracks, completed the Graduate course and completed the Excel Youth Instructor course.

Positive partnerships are key to the success of HideOut's sporting focus. In 2022, HideOut has worked in partnership with local and national organisations:

Sports at HideOut is a gateway for confidence and young people's social needs.

When Jaaziah's mum saw HideOut promote Snow Camp opportunities on their social media channels, she decided that he needed to try something new and signed him up to become a member so he could take part in the opportunity.

Jaaziah, a 15-year-old boy from East Manchester, joined HideOut with the focus of engaging in the Snow Camp project. Snow Camp is a national snowsports youth charity working with young people across the UK.

On Jaaziah first day of HideOut, his mum attended the Youth Zone and met with HideOut's Sports Coordinator. She expressed her concerns that Jaaziah lacked social skills and was conscious that he was always locking himself away in his room on his computer.

Jaaziah's mum wanted him to do something productive, which is why when she saw the Snow Camp opportunity, she felt the need to sign him up.

In the longer term, Jaaziahs' mum hoped that he would gain the confidence to become more social and find a new passion.

Jaaziah successfully engaged with Snow Camp and completed First Tracks.

Due to his success and positive engagement, Jaaziah was then chosen to complete the Graduate course.

Jaaziah was praised for his positive attitude and was a standout student on the course.

Although still a little shy, Jaazjah then started to speak to different staff and young people and began to engage with HideOut's universal sessions throughout the week.

He now regularly attends sessions and is growing in confidence every day.

When he's at HideOut I know he's safe, he's going to have something to eat, it's a warm environment, and I trust the staff... I feel comfortable with them looking after my son.

I joined HIdeOut for Snow Camp, but I eventually liked coming here regardless, just to try and get involved with other people and the community that there is at HideOut. Since coming to the universal sessions I've been a lot more confident around people who I wouldn't have known. It's also influenced me to try new things and get out of my comfort zone.

CREATIVE Supporting talent

HideOut Youth Zone provides an avenue for all young people to be able to express themselves creatively and offers various art forms across its programme, including:

- Art
- Dance •
- Drama
- Film & Multi-media
- Music & Podcasting

Using amazing facilities and state-of-the art equipment, with access to talented Youth Workers active within the industry, young people have the opportunity to create openly without barriers.

Having the advantage of the city-centre's cultural influence, HideOut encourages young people to explore their talents and have confidence in accessing the opportunities that Manchester presents.

In 2022, we saw one young person release their own EP, two young people hold their own youth-based events in the community, and one young person now DJs regularly at Manchester's famous Band on the Wall.

HideOut's robust relationship with Manchester's creative sector has seen positive partnerships evolve:

Particular attention is placed on the opportunity to explore culture, heritage and identity through the arts, and 2022 saw a number of projects taking place:

- Spoken Word LOOPs

It's important young people have access to, understand, and celebrate their heritage. Two-thirds of HideOut's membership is made up of young people from diverse ethnic backgrounds, so it's really important to show where these cultural influences stemmed from and for young people to ultimately feel seen.

The Hip-Hop project has given our young people the opportunity to explore heritage in a fun and engaging way. But, it's also been an opportunity for them to understand the power young people can have and the movements they can make, whic is what HideOut is all about.

Staff feedback

Young people use the creative arts to find their voice.

Jennifer, a Senior Club member at HideOut, came to the Youth Zone in late 2021. She was very shy and quiet.

Jennifer was very pessimistic about meeting new people and kept herself to herself , with a very select group of friends.

Jennifer would be very introverted and find it hard to make eye contact when talking to staff and would often have her head down when talking.

After several months working with youth workers, who encouraged her to try new things in music, make friends and have general conversations, Jennifer began to grow in confidence.

A Youth Worker then saw and heard Jennifer's amazing voice along with the fantastic talent of playing the ukulele. The team worked with Jennifer to explore her talent and encouraged her to create songs. From this, Jennifer started to flourish and found her true style and sound.

Jennifer began to learn new skills and became interested in producing and engineering.

With her new confidence, Youth Workers have seen Jennifer's friendships grow and she now has multiple friends she feels comfortable with and can trust.

Youth Workers still aim to work with Jennifer to improve her confidence in taking part in activities without her friends, and encourage her to try other areas of interest, such as sports. She has started engaging in football when it is quieter to build her confidence to take part in busier sessions.

With her confidence growing, Jennifer took the opportunity to perform at HideOut's International Women's Day event with an audience of over 200 people including sportswomen, young people and local youth organisations.

She was amazing and was beaming with pride for weeks after.

I've made a few more close friends that I trust at HideOut. I also performed at HideOut in front of the whole Seniors Club for International Women's Day BY MYSELF. I also have become really confident to lead recording sessions recording myself and friends.

Year round supports

For some young people, school holidays can be difficult.

Without routine, regular support and access to meals, some young people can feel lost without access to the educational system.

HideOut delivers a Holiday Club programme each school holiday throughout the year, meaning year round support to young people - seven days a week, 52 weeks of the year.

Holiday Club is for 8-12 year olds and offers a safe and affordable space for young people with a range of activities.

Holiday Club often receives vital funding from Manchester City Council, meaning free spaces are available for those on Free School Meals, with the aim of tackling 'Holiday Hunger'. Many families in Manchester struggle to provide their children with healthy, nutritious meals which young people would normally receive, free of charge, at school.

Recent studies have shown that some children may lose up to half a stone over the summer holidays.

At our Holiday Club, we provide young people with breakfast, 'proper home cooked' meals at lunchtime and an afternoon snack.

Holiday Clubs in 2022 have benefited from support from Patrons and supporters who have often volunteered their time or even run 'Take Over Days' at the Youth Zone. Holiday Club is a strong part of HideOut's DNA, and offers spaces for up to 75 young people per day.

In 2022, HideOut listened to the needs of its members and trialled a successful first Senior Holiday Club in the summer, which ran again in the Winter.

I wanted to feedback on your Holiday Club sessions and thank you and the team for all the hard work you have put into engaging with my children, supporting them and making us all feel welcome.

They have never been able to attend a Holiday Club before. Most activities say they're inclusive, but that's a buzz word these days. We see their faces drop when we question how that inclusivity actually works... the kids know it's 'not for your kind'. Therefore we tend to rock and roll through holiday periods isolated.

Both of my children are previously looked after and are not allowed to attend school. We come under Education Other Than At School. Travelling around 450 miles-a-week to Alternative Provisions and a farm education centre for excluded children. There is a chronic issue currently with young people who have experienced harm and trauma that come through the Looked After System in education. It's happening all over the UK. Many of our amazing care experienced courageous young people are being excluded, punished, penalised and isolated for daring to show their trauma and SEN needs in all its glory in the classroom.

As you will know, a vulnerable child in school becomes an incredibly vulnerable child out of school, open to all kinds of wrongs. With misplaced deep seated shame pumping through their veins from being part of 'The Excluded', their world becomes smaller more hidden and a murkey place where the gravest of elders hunt for pray.

A few months ago, one of my children started to go down an awful rabbit hole which brought us to the attention of the police and children's services. Luckily, we have had good contact with Manchester Police who worked with us in a supportive way, so rather than criminalising a child so young, they put things in place to help. We have a large team of professionals around us working to support my children in a therapeutic way.

The missing part of this jigsaw was socialising in a safe way. My children don't have any friendship groups, social opportunities or young adults acting as positive peers and guidance to form healthy friendships. The Youth Club, the Holiday Club and your Sunday Inclusion group have given my family this and for that we are all incredibly grateful...

I need to give mention to the football coach who works with my son on a Sunday. His confidence is soaring around this youth worker. He simply told him he was good. That's all it took, an adult male noticed my son who didn't want to cause him harm and told him he was good.

You are open, caring and welcoming young people in. These small tings are changing out world. All of us are incredibly grateful.

EMPLOYABILITY & ENTERPRISE

Reachout

We really wanted to work collaboratively with young people from the community, so HideOut was a natural partnership. Since then we've gone on to recruit a young person from the Youth Zone as a Digital Communicator. It's just been great to give an opportunity to a young person from the local area to join this team. I know this young person has learnt a lot and he's really enjoyed it - he's been so helpful to us as an organisation.

Partner feedback

Employability and Enterprise support is available for any young people who need help getting into employment, education or training.

HideOut wants all young people to have the opportunity to succeed, and supports learning outside the classroom. Over the past year, HideOut has been building its new Employability and Enterprise programme, with particular focus on:

- Employability
- Enterprise
- Mentoring
- **Education and training**

Using the strong support from Patrons and other local businesses, young people have had the opportunity to experience the world of work first-hand through dedicated trips, placements and workshops.

Young people have also had the opportunity to boost their CV through various AQA approved certifications and Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) opportunities.

HideOut Youth Zone supported 96 young people to gain a Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) certificate of achievement, with 22 young people completing their DofE Bronze Award following a two-day expedition.

The completion followed several training sessions with The Duke of Edinburgh's Award in the City of Manchester which included an introduction into map reading, country code, rucksack essentials and basic first aid training.

With 90% of HideOut Youth Zone's membership being those living within the top 10% of the most deprived areas of the UK, and with 20% being those who identify as having an additional need or disability, HideOut Youth Zone worked to reduce barriers to participation and to place emphasis on community access for all members.

HideOut was able to successfully enrol young people onto the cohort by paying their participation fee, whilst also providing all young people with kit for their expedition (including rucksacks, walking boots, waterproofs, compasses, Trangias and food bought to cook whilst on their venture). HideOut was able to ensure all members had access to this opportunity, despite financial obstacles and the socioeconomic prejudices around the programme.

Over 25% of those who completed the Bronze Award with HideOut were those who identified as having an additional need or disability. Thanks to funding received, they were supported in completing the programme with the same high aspirations as their peers.

HideOut was able to create and provide a visual aid route card using photographs and easy read language which enabled members to independently orient themselves throughout the expedition. The team also worked with these members on role play. This included developing key phrases for members to use when directing themselves in the community including directional sentence openers and making conversation with people about the countryside.

Knowledge of staff was paramount throughout, with funding ensuring staff could complete their Duke of Edinburgh Expedition Skills (DES) course across the summer months. The course gave them the theoretical and practical skills needed to support expeditions with young people.

The expedition gave young people the opportunity to leave their inner city estate and experience the countryside, with some young people even seeing livestock up close for the first time.

Following completion of the expedition, young people developed news skills such as confidence, resilience and teamwork, whilst also showcasing newfound friendships:

My best bit of the walk is the canal and then I tried my best to walk up hills and I was very happy. I feel very proud of myself. I used communication skills and I am very supportive to support my team because walking is good exercise.

You know what, it's been the best achievement I've had. I thought when people said 'it'll be the best experience, you'll remember it for the rest of your life', that it was just a line. But it was sick. I've achieved something I never thought I could do

Since completion of the programme, HideOut has been noted as the 'best in UK for delivering DofE for young people' and attained the Manchester DofE Award at the Manchester Outdoor Education Conference in October 2022.

NGUS ON Equality & equity

At HideOut, we ensure our youth provision is inclusive, supports community cohesion, and provides an environment where members from diverse demographics, ethnic communities and those with additional needs or disabilities feel safe, involved and welcome.

Across the year, HideOut hosted a number of events to promote equality and diversity, including:

- Community Iftar

- International Women's Day
 Black History Month
 LGBTQ+ Pride Party
 Monthly 'Girls Only' Sessions (HoneyBeez)
- Young Carers Festival

At HideOut, we try to make all our sessions accessible and open to all abilities.

Our Inclusion Team is fully trained to support young people with disabilities and additional needs. The team makes sure that each and every young person who attends can get involved in the activities they want to, regardless of ability.

Sunday Club however, is a time just for young people that identify as having a disability or additional needs, and looks to encourage members to feel confident and increase independence.

- Over 20% of our members identified as having additional needs or a disability
- There were 3184 visits to Sunday Club
- 478 different young people attended **Sunday Club**

HideOut created dedicated events and projects, such as 'Sunday Club Socials' and 'Figure-Out challenge', which committed to tackling struggles with interaction, communication and confidence in social situations.

At HideOut, we understand social skills are important for building relationships, making friends and learning, so we support our young people who may struggle in this area in a fun and empowering way.

l can't get over how amazing the facilities are.

My child can't go out into the community alone, so to come into the HideOut community, join in, and purchase his own lunch at the cafe - it's helping develop his independence and confidence.



HideOut encourages professional and personal development in all staff.

In 2022, HideOut provided new avenues for progression for staff and volunteers, and even created new roles to support the growth of the Youth Zone.

Taylor, one of HideOut's sessional Youth Workers, began her HideOut journey in October 2021.

Taylor is from the local community of East Manchester and grew up just a few streets away from where HideOut currently stands. Taylor is incredibly passionate about young people understanding and using the opportunities HideOut gives to them, as it's something many local young people didn't have when she was younger.

Since working at HideOut, Taylor has supported all the Clubs at the Youth Zone, paying particular attention to the SEN needs of young people, supporting the transition from Junior Club to Senior Club and helping young people navigate the world of young adults.

Taylor always shows incredible and dedicated commit to her work and continually champions HideOut's number one value: Young People First.

In October 2022, Taylor put herself forward for a newly developed role at HideOut: 'Deputy Youth Club Coordinator', and was successful in her application.

Taylor has continued to develop herself both personally and professionally in her new role.

She is currently undertaking 'Youth Work Principles Level 2' training and is part of the OnSide Network mentoring programme.

Taylor is also taking on more responsibilities at the Youth Zone and has taken the lead on HideOut's new Youth Voice programme (including members attending the Greater Manchester Youth Combined Authority). This new direction for HideOut is bringing a Youth Led approach to all areas of the Youth Zone.

Taylor also took the lead on recent engagement with local schools to gather feedback about HideOut, ensuring all demographics were heard and that feedback was used efficiently to create change. Across the course of sixweeks Taylor and the team managed to gather feedback from over 350 local young people.

In February 2023, Taylor was officially recognised in HideOut's 'StandOut' Staff and Volunteer Recognition programme. She won under the Collaborative' category,having been nominated in all categories reflecting HideOut's values.

We are excited to see how Taylor develops further in her role.

This last year, I have loved seeing the passionate work of HideOut staff and volunteers and the limitless potential of our members. In my new role, I will elevate young people's voices so that the Youth Zone continues to reflect their interests and offers them support they may need along the way.
